Introductory note:

Omissions: Names of book reviewers, authors of books reviewed, writers of obituary notices and annual reports are not included in the Author Index.

Articles and news items are listed in *chronological order* under the name of the author.

The **method of alphabetisation** used is *word by word*. Surnames beginning with 'Mc' are alphabetized as 'Mac'.

References are to volume number (in **bold**), followed by year and page number. In the period 1955 to 1998, volume numbers covered several years. (N) following a page reference indicates a *note*
